It is bedded rehabilitation units that help patients improve their strength; achieve greater independence and gain the confidence to return home. Nursing staff are available 24 hours. Each patient is allocated a named nurse who is responsible for ensuring their nursing and care needs are met. It is for residents who have a Westminster GP. The length of time patients stay varies according to their individual goals, and a typical stay could be anything between one to six weeks. Referrals can be made by GPs, Hospitals, Social workers |

When you leave hospital, Social services may be able to help with some activities such as washing, dressing, shopping and housework. | 4 | Community Rehabilitation Service | | | 0207 641 4001 | Provides treatment programmes to promote independence with daily activities, advice and/or treatment for communication and swallowing difficulties, indoor and outdoor walking practice, advice and training to people, carers and their families, intensive rehabilitation following a new stroke, assessments for equipment or minor home adaptations to aid independence as part of a rehabilitation programme, access to the community and practice using public transport, emotional support. Referrals can be made by GPs, Hospitals, Social services |
| 5 | Early supported rehabilitation Unit | | | 020 8962 3962 | Rehabilitation and support. Provides services for people at home once they have left hospital, and help them regain their independence through a programme of exercise and practice of daily tasks. It is for Westminster residents over the age of 16 who require rehabilitation support at home after a hospital. Rehabilitation team provides suitable patients with an intensive 2 week therapy regime post their hospital discharge. Rehabilitation team visits a patient in hospital to assess their rehabilitation needs and suitability for the service. Referrals are made by Health professionals and social care services from Charing Cross hospital, St Mary's hospital, St Thomas hospital, and University College London Hospital (UCLH). |
